

2024 Alzheimer's Respite Request for Proposal Questions & Answers

- 1. Question:** We received an email today about Alzheimer's Respite request for proposal. Is this the Older American Act proposal/funding? If so, it will now be a 3-year contract versus a 1-year contract?

Answer: No, this is for Alzheimer's Respite funding. Although, it is now going to a 4-year cycle like the Older Americans Act proposal.
- 2. Question:** I am unable to edit the Alzheimer's Respite RFP instructions-Forms PDF Document. Would you please send me a version that allows editing?

- 3. Question:** I wanted to see if you would send over bid documents for the bid for RFP - Adult Day Service, Respite Reimbursement and Institutional Care Respite Services.

- 4. Question:** Do you know how many consumers need this service?

Answer: We do not track this data. If you provide any of the listed services and are interested in serving individuals with Alzheimer's Disease or a related dementia, you can submit an application for potential funding.
- 6. Question:** Is an applicant able to request a dollar amount award different than what was asked for in the past?

Answer: Yes, your budget should be based off of providing the service.
